4TH August 2016





Dhankar, Agriculture Minister, Government of Haryana assembled at New Delhi Airport to depart for San Francisco, Post check-in the delegates headed towards their first visit to UC Davis where they closely observed the Agriculture, horticulture, Animal Husbandry and food processing units. After the extensive field visits, the delegates attended a scheduled meeting with the Government official and a late-night dinner meeting with the Indian Officials. Ending the hectic day, the delegates went to their hotels for the night.




5TH August 2016

to visit Apio INC. factory where once again various aspects of the Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry and Food Processing units were extensively explored.









7TH August 2016

Next Day, the delegates had an early start to the day and visited the Agriculture Fields, Seed Farms, and had a close look at the Farm Mechanization and soil conservation methods. Horticulture fields and Animal Husbandry units were also examined. The Delegates tried to understand the intricacies of a Female Calf Sex Technology unit installed in the factory they were visiting.















Day 5 was an important one as the delegates attended a meeting with the Governor, the Secretary and the Minister of IOWA state wherein an extensive discussion regarding a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) took place. Post meeting the delegates headed towards the IOWA State University. After a long day, the delegates had dinner with various government officials, where official, Agriculture leaders and a few fellow Indians.





The next day the delegates checked-out from the hotel early in the morning and boarded a flight to Atlanta, Georgia where they first attended the American Society of Horticulture Science (ASHS) Conference and then paid an extensive visit to Agriculture & Horticulture units, animal husbandry and dairy fisheries, and the food processing units nearby.



DAY 10TH August 2016

On 10th August, 2016 the delegates presented an important report representing the State of Haryana, India in a conference held at the Sheron Hotel, Atlanta. As the conference got over the delegates met some Horticulture Experts and discussed about the horticulture issues and methods employed in their State. After the brief meeting, the delegates again visited the nearby Agriculture/Horticulture and food processing units.

Memorandum of Cooperation Between the Department of Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare, Haryana and Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship

As a result of Iowa Secretary of Agriculture Bill Northey's visits to India in 2013, and the subsequent visit to Iowa by Mr. Om Prakash Dhankar, Minister of Department of Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare, Haryana, in August 2016, the two leaders met and agreed to formalize a relationship in which Haryana and Iowa can work more closely together to promote collaborations and partnerships in agriculture with the ultimate goal of enhancing the quality of life for the citizens of Haryana, Iowa and the world.

- I. Both parties to this Memorandum of Cooperation agree that agriculture comprises all aspects of food and feed production and processing including but not limited to: human, animal and plant sciences, bio-renewable technology and supporting technologies and industries.
- II. Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship (IDALS) and the Department of Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare, Haryana have an abiding interest in the development and promotion of agriculture and believe there are many areas of interest and collaborative business opportunities to mutually benefit both parties. Both sides agree to support cooperative academic research, exchanges and development efforts.
- III. IDALS and the Department of Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare, Haryana agree to work through academic, private sector, associations/organizations and private industry to create linkages and opportunities that will lead to initiatives where the strengths of the two parties are brought together for the greater benefit of both of them.
- IV. Both parties agree this Memorandum of Cooperation is an instrument to expand existing exchanges, cooperation and collaborations, enhance existing Memorandums between Iowa and Haryana entities and develop new areas of partnerships.
- V. This Memorandum of Cooperation conveys no financial or program obligation from either side.
- VI. This Memorandum of Cooperation is valid through December 31, 2018, but can be cancelled by either side by written, 30-day notice. The agreement can be extended by mutual consent. IDALS and the Department of Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare, Haryana will each constitute a Working Group that will jointly prepare a plan of action in furtherance of this Memorandum of Cooperation.


The delegation will share best practices in agriculture, farm technology, systems and experience. Haryana is a sister-state of lown in implementation of agri-techniques.

Haryana and Iowa State, US to sign up as Sister States



Delegates from Government of Haryana led by Hon'ble Agriculture Minister of Haryana, Shri O P Dhaukar undertakes an agriculture study tour to IOWA State, USA to meet with companies and officials to begin building relationships for future business growth and collaboration.

IOWA State, US has agreed to sign up as Sister state with the Haryana State for cooperation in the agriculture sector. The process of cooperation was initiated by Indian Council of Food and Agriculture(ICFA) and the menorandum of understanding was also facilitated by it. Ambassador Islam Siddiqui, Senior Advisor, Center for Strategic and International Studies, Washington DC, who the then as the Chief Agriculture Negotiator, US Administration had initiated this process during his visit to India in July 2015 after meeting with the Haryana Government officials. IOWA State has strong technological advancement and expertise in seeds R&D and production, natural resource management, agri-business incubation, environmental sciences, northwatation and frontier meas of agriculture and thus the collaboration would prove to be an important link in the chain for disseminating the same.



About IOWA Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship

OUTCOMES / FEEDBACKS OF THE EVENT

The US tour opened various opportunities which could possibly be delved into and explored.

The minister and the high level officials have already started helping the farmers to shift from rice cultivation to horticulture and dairy farming in order to meet the increasing demands in Delhi metro. It was indicated that 5% of Haryana area is already under these high value productions. They are keen to cover at least 25% of area in the next 5 years under diversified agriculture. They are interested in climate smart technologies, peri- urban agriculture; controlled agriculture and plan to cover all aspects from production to the entire value chain to the consumer. They had a vision and preliminary strategy, and the visit to California, Georgia and Iowa allowed exploring the available technologies and possible cooperation.

In Washington, due to the efforts of Drs. Suresh Babu, Madhur Gautam and Ambassador Siddiqui, a fruitful and productive discussion took place at IFPRI, The World Bank and USDA. They requested support in acquisition of technologies, skill development and particularly investments from the World Bank to realize this transformation. It was agreed that the Government will share their efforts and thoughts if they require Bank's technical assistance in further developing the strategy, action plans and investments to implement the strategy. The Bank representatives appreciated Haryana Government's vision and strategy for transformative agriculture from green revolution rice, wheat production which is facing new challenges. The Bank indicated its willingness to help the Government in this transition.

IFPRI promised to share their global knowledge and experiences with Haryana Government if requested.

The meetings and discussions promised a positive result and it was unanimously agreed that it is an important agenda and opportunity to cooperate.
